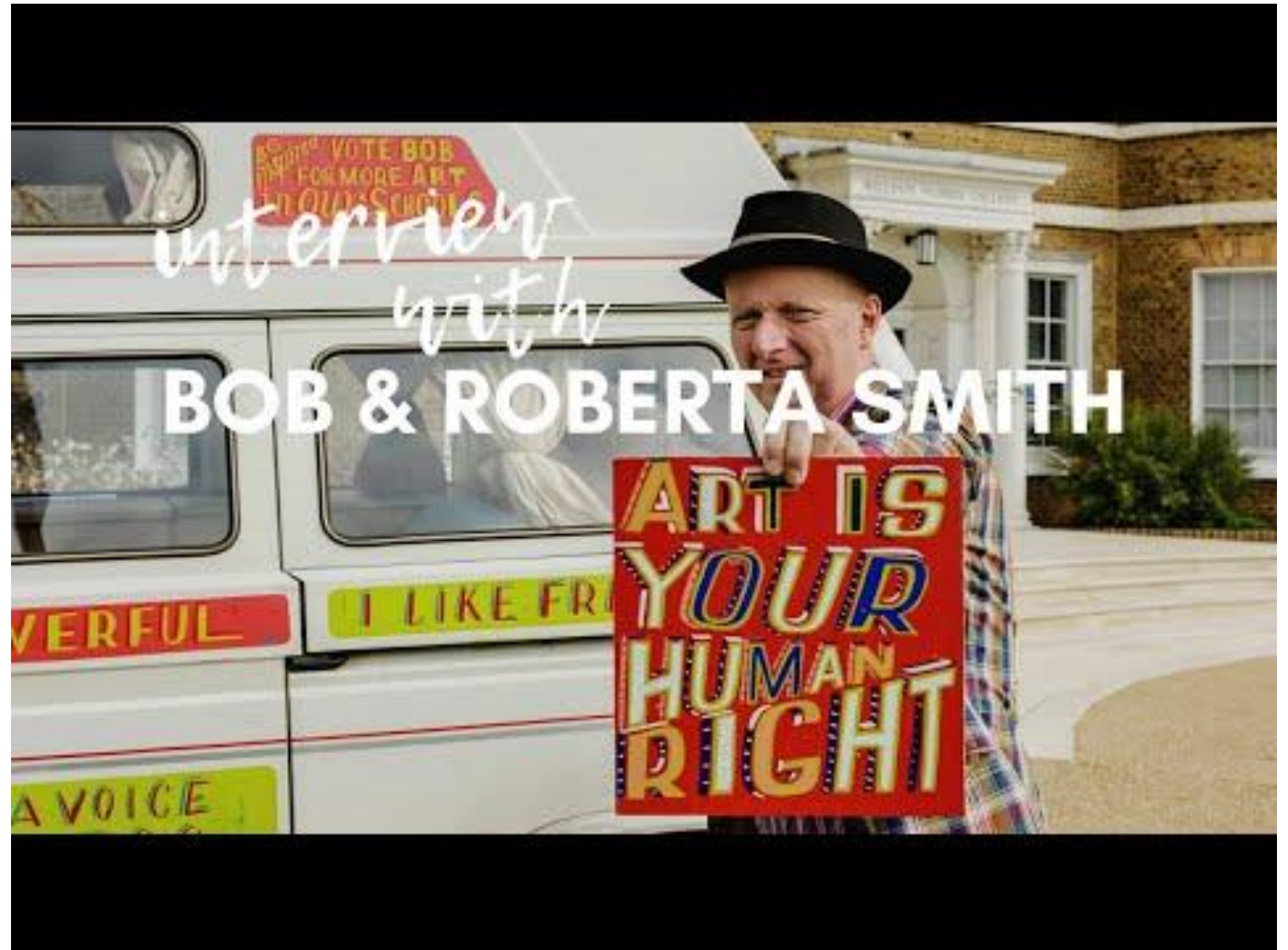




How different

- Have your thoughts changed from the start to where we are now?

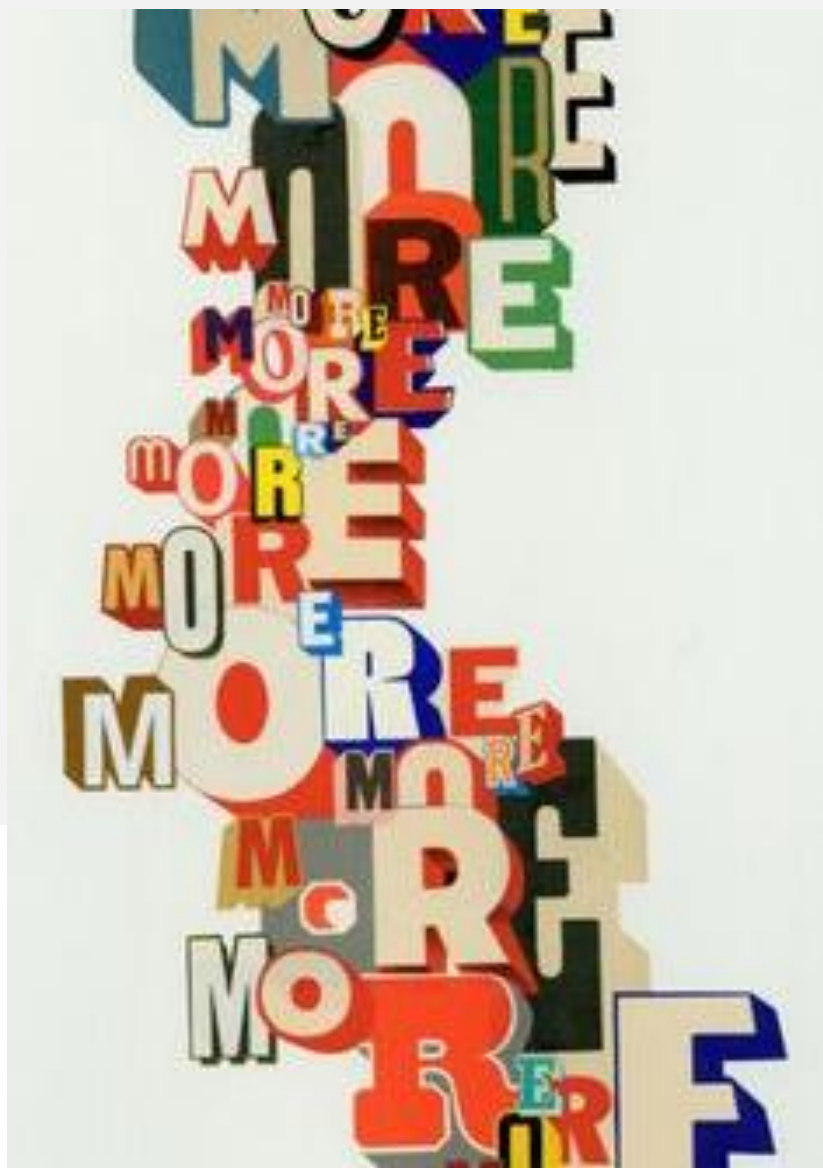
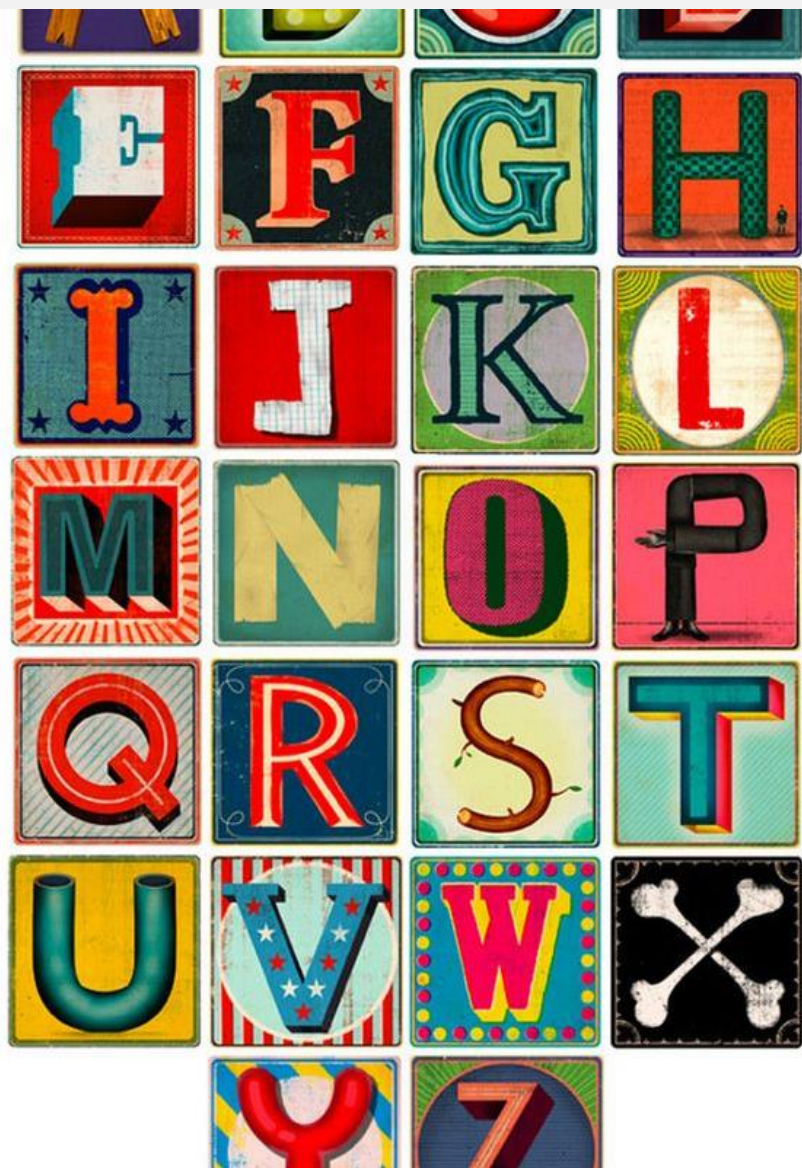
Start by creating a

style and add colour.

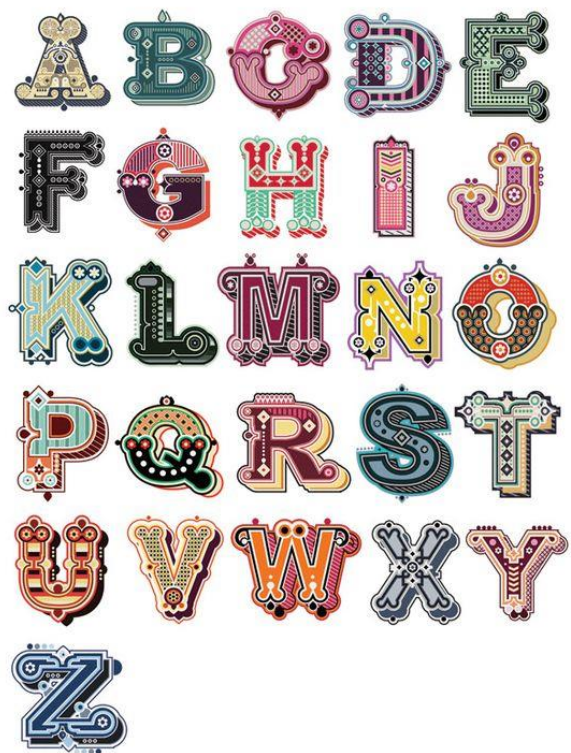
- Try not to feel limited by what you think other people might think.

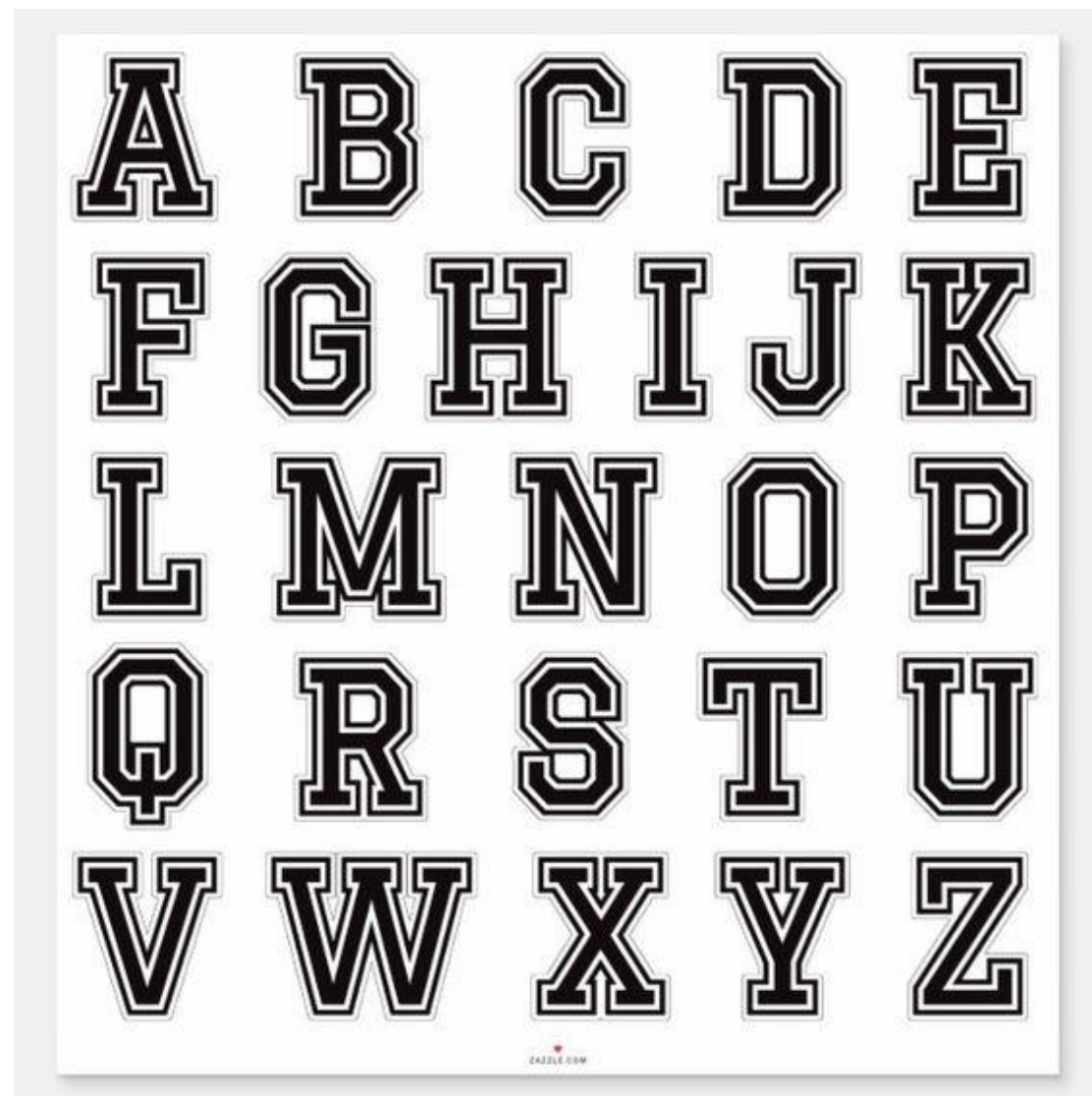
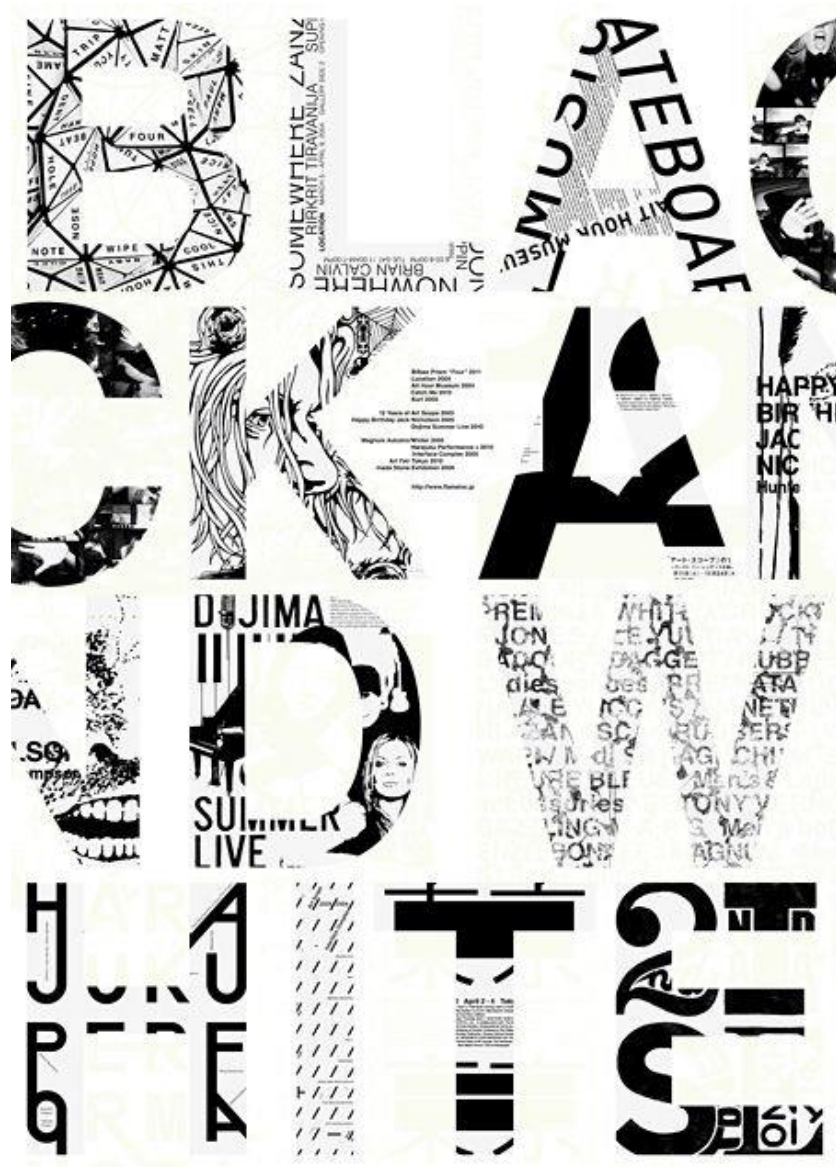
